



Step 1 is the embroidered flag pole.

Step 2 is fabric placement line.

Step 3 tacks down the fabric. Trim fabric before moving on to the next step.

Because this is a bean stitch applique, you may want to leave more of a seam allowance than trimming as close as possible like a traditional applique design.

-- For a raggy style applique, include a layer of flannel below the fabric, leave a quarter-inch seam allowance and fray the edges when complete.

-- For a more polished look, use a fusible product like Heat n Bond Lite and trim a bit closer.

Steps 4-6 are the bean stitch and details on flag.
